

ANNUAL POETRY READING



For 28 years, the annual Langston Hughes Community Poetry Reading (LHCPR) has been the legacy event that remains the must-see opening entrée into Black History Month events in Rhode Island. It celebrates the late Langston Hughes' ties to this State as well as amplifies his extended reach beyond being the writer and voice of the Harlem Renaissance. This occasion also continues to bring people together. A diverse group - young, old and of different backgrounds, professions, abilities and races - reads and performs selected poems from Hughes' extensive collection of work in front of an audience that has been more than 500 people consistently over the last several years.

In addition to its annual poetry readings, the committee of organizers are committed to:

- Being the torch bearer in New England for Hughes and his important contributions to American history, culture, and civic philosophy
- Raise awareness to all about the impact of Hughes' life and work then and now
- Introduce and teach curriculum about Hughes to younger generations and showcase the lessons learned with youth events
- Foster community with Hughes' work as a natural conduit for engaged conversation and deep consideration
